- 5. Who does Israel send in front of him to Joseph, and why is this significant?
- 6. What do you suppose the reunion between Joseph and Jacob was like?

- 7. What does Joseph secure for his family in these verses?
- 8. How long do the brothers intend to live in Egypt according to v. 4? Why do you think they speak of it this way?

BONUS: We don't have any ancient sources that speak of Egyptian detestation of shepherds (end of v. 34). What might this verse be referencing?

9. What does Jacob do for Pharaoh and how is this a fulfillment of the covenant of God?
