Dear Partners at St. Mark's,

My love for you and our congregation, and longing to gather together again, grows more and more every week in this time of social distancing. I speak for all the staff when I say we yearn for the day we can safely and appropriately gather together in large numbers. Until that time, and in preparation for it, I want you to know how powerfully God is moving in our midst.

Let me ask you a question: Is COVID-19 and the ensuing society-wide social distancing measures an "interruption" to the way we do things as a church or a major "disruption." Do we expect things to simply go back to the way they were once this is all over or is God wanting to do something new in these times? That's a question I've been asking myself and the answer I continue to hear God whisper in my ear is that this is a major disruption - that God wants to break the church of its addiction to a one hour Sunday morning worship routine and center us once again on the mission of the other 167 hours of the week.

I've asked the same question of the recent racial tensions over the murder of George Floyd. "God, what are you speaking to your church through this?" And again the answer is not simply an interruption so that things "return to normal" after tensions settle down, but a disruption forcing the church to address its inherent cultural and ethnic biases. If we believe what the Bible says that God can work all things for good (Romans 8:28), then maybe God is using the compounding of these two society-disrupting events to change the church for the better. I believe this is the case for St. Mark's and I believe God is already moving in powerful ways to change how we "do church".

Let me highlight just a few of the ways God is powerfully moving at St. Mark's:

▶ I am amazed at the **FAITHFULNESS** of the financial support of so many people at St. Mark's! Your generosity is enabling us to move forward with our mission. Year to date, we are only 1% off of our projected giving. Thank you!

Wow! God is bringing gems to our staff at a time when we desperately need them. I can't wait for everyone to get to know **KELLY FRAMPTON**, our new Director of Communications and Marketing (started May 27th), **BAILEY COMEGYS**, our new Middle School Coordinator (starting mid-July), and most recently, **JOEL DRYZCIMSKI**, our new Production Coordinator (starting June 22nd).

We are now the **PROUD OWNERS** of the house on the corner of East Robins Road and C Avenue! This has been part of our strategic plan for years and it became a reality on June 2nd. Praise God!

We're working on a way to grow **DISCIPLES** right now. I won't use this space to elaborate on it, but watch for what we call our "discipleship process" in the future.

We are actively pursuing **BETTER**VIDEO AND LIVE-STREAMING

CAPABILITIES for BOTH worship centers and for enhanced online distribution of uniquely St. Mark's resources. Look for more info over the summer.

➤ By God's grace we are not idling sitting by in the face of racism, but beginning conversations and ministry relationships that will move us to greater **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**. This is just beginning, but God has already created connections for us to pursue.

Finally, **THE STAFF** at St. Mark's has absolutely been fantastic in their response to these difficult times. They have stepped up, and for many of them, have put in tremendous extra hours fulfilling responsibilities that weren't in their original job descriptions. Thank you!

God is doing a new thing at St. Mark's! I know this might be difficult to see during these stressful times of social distancing and racial tensions, but I can tell you with absolute assurance that God is moving mightily and we are growing stronger as a church, not just waiting for things to "get back to normal." We are a movement of Jesus followers. Jesus is on the move!






