




2022 SERMON SERIES







FAITHLIFE GROUPS

FaithLife Groups (what we call small groups!) help individuals get connected in community and grow in their faith. Our FaithLife groups are three or more people who meet together regularly for fellowship, Bible studies, service projects, and more.

WE'RE BETTER TOGETHER

St. Mark's offers many opportunities to get plugged in and connected to other partners and community members.

2X4 MINISTRY

2x4 was a new women's ministry held in the Fall. Participants were paired in groups of two and groups of four. The first half of the month, the groups of two met for coffee, lunch, or a walk for the purpose of getting to know other women from St. Mark's. The second half of the month, two groups of two women would meet to do the same. By the time the end of November rolled around, each of the women had met and gotten acquainted with 9 other women!

It was fun to see so many new relationships forming for the **35+ WOMEN** who participated!

ALPHA

In January, we held the Alpha on Sunday mornings after worship and had three groups complete the course. In September, we offered Alpha on Tuesday evenings, inviting our congregation as well as our friends and co-workers in Christ from Hope CDA.

IF: GATHERING

IF:Gathering exists to equip women with gospelcentered resources, events, and community so they may learn more about who God is and disciple other women right where they are.

Each year, IF hosts a huge virtual women's conference which they live stream around the world. We host an IF:Local — a gathering of local people to watch the live stream right here at St. Mark's. It's an amazing event with God-honoring nationally-known speakers and musicians that will fill your soul with God's truth.

At IF:2022, we had **25 WOMEN** attend the live stream event in March, and about a dozen more that joined us for break-out sessions in August.

STRENGTHS

We want our folks to connect with their purpose. One of the tools we use is CliftonStrengths. God made each one of us in a wonderfully magnificent way. We are set apart and to be seen with awe. Don't believe us? Read Psalm 139. We want everyone to see themselves and others in the same way God sees us: as masterpieces!

In 2022 we offered **SEVEN STRENGTHS CLASSES WITH 52 PEOPLE** learning how to

use their strengths in all facets of life. That's 52 more folks who are using their strengths in their marriages, work places, and as they parent their children and in the community. That's how it's done, St. Mark's!

Jesus said in Matthew 16, "In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." We continue to see our St. Mark's partners let their light show the goodness of God to our community and world! This year instead of Beautiful Day, we changed it to a **BEAUTIFUL WEEK**: a week-long event serving our community and neighbors. Some of the activities included washing windows of 11 of our partners, making 50+ freezer meals for the guys at Hope CDA, and providing household items to Chains Interrupted for two women rescued from sex trafficking.

Locally, we continue to partner with **MISSION OF HOPE** with over 50 partners either volunteering or providing ingredients, for our monthly meal. Mission of Hope feeds 140-150 people each week day. Additionally, men at St. Mark's are filling the role of "coaches" to participants of **HOPE CDA** and serving in leadership positions.



In the summer of 2022, we had 188 volunteer spots to fill **FLY** (Feeding Lunches to Youth). FLY regularly provides over 1800 lunches each week.

We also continue to partner with **WELLINGTON HEIGHTS COMMUNITY CHURCH**, donating to their Blessings Box with items such as toiletry essentials.

St. Mark's developed a new relationship with **CALMS** in Panama. Our mission team of six in May 2022 was the first group that CALMS had brought to the area of Tierras Altas. From this trip we began a relationship with the small elementary school that we served. In November 2022, eight partners were able to continue and grow that relationship. We see God opening doors and we are so excited!

We continue to pray for our friends at **UCI** in Haiti and look forward to when we can return. 84 school kids at UCI received Christmas gifts from their sponsors. We were also able to provide funds for rice and beans for the community (hunger is at a critical stage in Haiti). St. Mark's also continues to support missionaries around the world from Japan, to Papua New Guinea, to Panama, to right here in lowa.

We love to walk with you in all times of your and your family's life. This year we have provided care for our partners and families in many ways. We have a team of **21 CARE TEAM LEADERS** who help us accomplish this important ministry. We are so thankful for their servant hearts!

HOSPITAL VISITS: Visitors are an important part of the recovery process and can help people recover faster and also help reduce their anxiety and stress.

SHUT IN VISITS: where we take communion and pray with people on a monthly basis.

GRIEFSHARE: We completed a GriefShare course in early 2022, then hosted a "Surviving The Holidays" seminar in November. With the new year, we will begin a new GriefShare course.

PRE-MARITAL COUNSELING: We hosted 5 weddings in 2022!

SUNDAYS: The goal of our St. Mark's Hospitality Ministry is to provide a welcoming environment for partners, guests, and friends in order to enhance their worship experience, encourage fellowship, and help build community. We love our times of fellowship and connection on Sunday mornings in the Connections Cafe to reflect on the message, catch up with old friends, and meet new ones. We are so thankful for this ministry!

MONDAY-SATURDAY: We really began to open up our building this year and hosted over 150 community events in 2022! Hosting events of other organizations is a great way to bring in new people from our community and to serve those in need.

St. Mark's moved the fiscal year to July 1 - June 30 on July 1, 2022. This does not impact your giving schedule, but it does allow the church's operating budget the time to adjust mid-year if needed based upon current giving.




