

#### **MAKING BOLD MOVES**

It's hard to find a church these days as old as St. Mark's - I 38 years old on November 8! And it's even harder to find one as thriving as St. Mark's! Happy birthday St. Mark's, or should I say "The Swedish Evangelical Lutheran Saron Congregation of Cedar Rapids"?

St. Mark's was started in 1885 by 16 charter members who averaged 28 years old and had all been born in Sweden. Church services were in Swedish and the first year's offering amounted to a whopping \$125 (which is around \$4,000 today). When you consider its humble beginnings, our church has really been blessed by God!

Let that sink in for a bit. I 6 people committed their time and money to start a new church and I wonder how many of them ever thought their little Swedish church would become a thriving, 2,000 partner church! Of course, we made many bold moves as a church over the years to get to this point. Let me share a few that I think are particularly bold:

- •1891: We bought a piece of land and built our first church at 2nd Ave and 3rd St SW, Cedar Rapids. It was a traditional rectangular church with a sloped roof and a steeple.
- 1911: Under the leadership of Pastor E. C. Jesup, we started offering worship services in English. While this might seem like a no-brainer in the US today, back then it was a momentous and sometimes contentious change to speak "the language of the people."
- **1914:** To identify more readily with our Englishspeaking culture, the church was renamed to "Saron English Lutheran Church."
- •1916: Women were allowed to vote at our church even though the state of lowa had just denied women that opportunity in state elections (lowa wouldn't change this until 1919). Imagine the counter-cultural boldness of our congregation!
- •Around 1920: We assimilated into our church the Danish Lutheran Church of Cedar Rapids. Today we call this a "church merger" where a healthy church accepts the remnant of another church.
- 1945: We changed our name once again to "St. Mark's Evangelical Lutheran Church" and began looking for a new location to build because we were outgrowing our previous one.
- •Tragedy struck on December 1, 1946: A fire and explosion destroyed the original church building. We happened to be without a pastor at the time, so we found ourselves without a building and a pastor for the first time in 57 years.

- July 10, 1949: After great perseverance and with much patience, we dedicated a newly constructed church building on 1st Ave and 21st St NE which still stands to this day.
- •1985: We were registered in the state of lowa under the name "St. Mark's Lutheran Church of Cedar Rapids, lowa." We have officially held this name since then.
- •1997: The land for our current location was donated. After much discussion, debate and prayer we decided to take the leap of faith and build a new church building. On May 2, 1999, we officially moved in.
- 2011: God blessed the growth of our church after our move and in 2011 we added on the Faith Worship Center and more space for education and offices to our current location. During this time we also joined the LCMC, Lutheran Churches in Mission for Christ, the denomination with which we are affiliated.
- •2021: Finally, in response to the pandemic, we created a livestream ministry which launched on January 3, 2021 and now sees over 100 individual logins every Sunday.

It's definitely only by God's grace that we have seen the growth we have had over 138 years of ministry. Inspired by God's grace, we have made crucial and bold moves at just the right time to see new growth. I believe we are at one of those crucial times once again as we look to change our name to FaithLife Church and march boldly into our 140<sup>th</sup> year of ministry.

Please mark Sunday, January 28, 2024 on your calendar for a Voters' Meeting to take place to resolve to "do business as (DBA) FaithLife Church" (we are not planning as of this time to change our name with the state of lowa, but only to file a "DBA" which allows us to do business as "FaithLife Church").



#### **GIVING UPDATE**

The graph to the right shows giving at St. Mark's for the first quarter of our fiscal year (July-September 2023).

The General Fund is where your tithes and offerings go. It provides staff salaries, utilities, our programming, RightNow Media access, licensing for hymns, liturgy, and songs ... the list goes on and on! It's the fund that allows us to reach people with the gospel through our weekend services, family ministries, service opportunities, missions, and more.



#### SEMINARIAN UPDATE

Your Pastoral Interns, Michele Jones, Alice Murray, and myself have been busy with classes and "other requirements as assigned" since the school year began in August! We are in our sixth and final year before receiving our Masters of Divinity from the Masters' Institute. Our graduation date is scheduled for May 18, 2024! Please keep us in your prayers - we are so close but have a heavy workload this year!

Our **August** class was titled "Missio Dei" and required more reading than we had expected/anticipated/ever done before. We each packed 2 - 3" of paper into a 3-ring binder and read many articles and book sections on God's mission here in the world.

Our **September** class was "Gender Equality in Leadership". We were invited to read a wonderful book titled *The Blue Parakeet*, which helped us in rethinking how we read the Bible. Several appendices were also wonderful in highlighting the first century women, including the "New Women of Rome", and the women of Romans 16 (Junia is not alone). I had often glossed over this last chapter, but Paul specifically calls out certain women as "well known to the apostles" and those who "were in Christ before me".

We took two classes in **October**. In the first class, Leadership and Prayer, we focused on Nehemiah and how to be constantly in prayer (through four classic prayer paths and the Lectio Divina).

Our second class was called

"The Heart and Theology of Worship." We learned about Jewish worship practices from before the time of Christ through the first century Christian worship, through changes in medieval times, to modern day worship.

Our **November** class is titled Dynamics of Pneumatology (a five dollar word for Christian theology concerned with the Holy Spirit!) Our **December** class is on the book of Psalms. We've also got a couple of year-long projects in the hopper: our Capstone Project, a theology paper on a topic of our choice, and the Ministry Toolbox, which is another major project.

#### **SUNDAYS**

**SUNDAY SCHOOL** We have been averaging 25 students on Sunday mornings. A majority of these kids are in Kindergarten and 1st grade. If you have a 3-5 year old preschool/Pre-K student, we encourage you to bring them to Sunday School each week from 10:00-11:00 am. The kids love singing with Mr. Dave, playing with toys, hearing Bible stories, and making crafts.

THE EDGE This fall students have had the opportunity to learn from a variety of leaders on topics ranging from faithfulness to making our faith known to others. Coming off of the summer mission trip, we were on a spiritual high from witnessing



God move in miraculous ways. In the past few months we have had to learn how to be faithful in the valley as we all gotten back into our daily routines. We ask for prayers as we discern how to honor God in a high school setting.

#### WEDNESDAYS

We have been averaging 160 kids on Wednesday nights with 29 volunteers. Some of our "small" groups have grown pretty big! We would love to be able to split some of these big groups into smaller groups, but that means we need more volunteers! Our Wednesday nights consist of worship, dinner, large group teaching, game/service project, and small group time.

#### CONFIRMATION



In October 2023, we had 22 8th grade students affirm their baptism through Confirmation. It has been such a treat to walk alongside this group of young adults as they write their faith statements to share with their family and friends. These statements are filled with stories of how God has impacted their lives and what they understand to be true about Him.

Our new Confirmation program is going incredibly well! We have 24 students who have made the decision for themselves to dive deeper into what they believe to be true about God and wrestle with difficult questions. We've been meeting weekly to share a meal, work through Teen Alpha, and have small group discussion. In the spring we will transition to more conversation on the Small Catechism and why being a Lutheran is so great. This group of students will be confirmed in May as we reflect on all they've learned.

A BIG thank you to all our volunteers that support Family Ministry, love our students, and contribute to the success of our ministry!
