### **GENESIS: GOD AND THE ORIGINALS**

Does "God and the Originals" sound like a strange subtitle for a class on Genesis? If it does, don't worry, I can't draw comic book characters to go along with it! Ha! But I can teach on what it's all about and how it shapes the rest of scripture.

If you could only read one book from the Old Testament, I would tell you to read Genesis. While the Books of Psalms, Isaiah, and the historical records are certainly integral, without Genesis, so much of their meaning would be missed. Martin Luther, in his commentary on Genesis says that "There is nothing more beautiful in Holy Scripture than Genesis as a whole." I would agree.

It's beautiful because it's full of engaging plots, epic tales that span centuries, in depth analyses of individuals and families, some of the greatest heroes in scripture and some of the most evil villains. It is beautiful because there are stories of underdogs, poetic justice, miracles, and reconciliation. But above all it is beautiful because it shows us our origins - how we got here, what our purpose is, how we're broken, and God's plan to fix it all through Jesus. In fact, Genesis just means "origin." And that is exactly what it's all about.

You're invited to join me, whether you are a Bible veteran or scripture novice, as I teach through the Book of Genesis this school year. Genesis has 50 chapters which means it's gonna take some time, but please know that even if you can't make it to all of them, they will be recorded and put online every week - so feel free to come as often as you can.

Our format each week is pretty simple. I hand out study questions and we answer them either as a group or at our tables. Sometimes I hand out "to dos" between classes (like watch a video online or read the next couple of chapters), but none of it will be graded! Ha!

We'll meet in Connections Cafe each Thursday from 2:00-3:30 pm with classes starting September 14. We will also livestream each session, so you can watch live (just click the blue WATCH LIVE button on our website) or re-watch the recording at a later date! In the meantime, the partners and friends of St. Mark's have stepped up in a big way. Vacations, absences, and unpredictable activities have not prevented you from fulfilling your commitment to the MADE FOR **MORE** Capital Campaign.

- This three-year campaign that officially kicked off in April 2022, has received **60%** of the total amount committed! We have pledges (and cash gifts) totaling \$3,408,682, with \$2,034,073 paid through June 2023.
- 91% of those sharing God's financial resources with the campaign have made at least one payment.
- We remain committed to no campaign dollars spent until the cash is in hand.

### SABBATICAL REFLECTION

Thank you St. Mark's and the Church Council for understanding the importance of sabbatical for church workers. The time on sabbatical was incredibly valuable and was a blessing to not only me and my family, but I believe it will be to St. Mark's as well. During my time on sabbatical, I read <u>The Ruthless Elimination of Hurry</u> by John Mark Comer. He quotes his mentor as saying, "At this point in my life, I'm just trying not to miss the goodness of each day, and bring my best self to it." This sentence has stayed with me as I return to work. The sabbatical has allowed me to experience pause and I know that through the implementation of pause, I will be able to sustain healthier rhythms of rest and work and bring my best self to each day.

I was able to travel on sabbatical. During the Footsteps of Paul tour to Greece and Rome, I was blessed to be able to reaffirm my baptism with Pastor Ken Hennings in the same stream where Lydia was baptized. I got to sing the doxology in Ephesus, walk along the Roman road that Paul walked on, see where he may have been held as a prisoner in Philippi, experience the beauty of the poppies in bloom, be amazed by the massive structures that were built by the Romans, and walk through thousands of years of history. The culmination of this trip is a reminder of who God is. He is timeless and faithful across all generations. He pursues us when we feel far from him. He is love and I can be assured of his love for each of us.

A huge focus of the sabbatical was to reconnect with friends and to be fully present with my family. This most definitely happened during the sabbatical. It was a gift to take my sabbatical at this time before my oldest son Grant leaves for Columbia College Chicago in August. I was blessed to have more time to spend with my loved ones ... and there are too many stories to tell. We'll have to grab coffee to hear just a few of them.

I spent time listening to God's direction for me and St. Mark's. I am exactly where God wants me to be right now. That is incredibly clear. It has been and continues to be assured with no doubts. Again, thank you for allowing me to return to work rested and ready to dive into the work of the church.

**WHAT IS A SABBATICAL?** A sabbatical is designed to provide time for rest, renewal, and rejuvenation. The Harvard Business Review reported that employees return to work after a sabbatical with an increase in overall well-being and a decline in stress and these benefits remain long after returning to work. In addition, other employees expand their knowledge base, skills, and expertise. A sabbatical is designed to completely disconnect from the workplace.


