SMALL GROUPS

We value relationships. We want students to gather and grow in encouraging each other as they walk with Jesus - together! This is the best part of middle school ministry! Led by an older

This is the best part of middle school ministry! Led by an older generation, students are grouped by age to talk about reallife topics as they navigate the connection between church and everyday living.

WHAT IF MY CHILD WANTS TO INVITE A FRIEND?

That's great and highly encouraged! I just ask that you let our team know so we make enough food and that you send over that student's parent information just in case of an emergency.

If they want to continue coming past the initial visit, we want them to register so we can properly get safety information needed and get them on small group rosters for ourselves and leaders.





CURRICULUM.

During large group time, Cultivate and Anthem will both be hearing the same message. We will talk about real life things and how our faith relates to those things. God and the Bible are right here, right now things! We want to equip students to incorporate their faith into each day. We will discuss the following topics:

- BEYOND BELIEF: a series on <u>Doubts & Questions,</u> scripture focus = Exodus
 - When you doubt yourself, God can still use you.
 - When you doubt, it's okay to ask questions.
 - When you doubt, God still takes care of you.
- **MOST LIKELY TO:** a series on <u>Leadership</u>, scripture focus = Old AND New Testament stories
 - Great leaders follow through.
 - Great leaders choose integrity.
 - Great leaders follow God's lead.
- **ENOUGH:** a series on <u>Family</u>, scripture focus = Acts and the Epistles
 - When there isn't enough, God provides.
 - Our actions can speak when words aren't enough.
 - God's love is always enough.
- **GRATEFUL**: a series on <u>Christmas</u>, scripture focus = the Gospels
 - Be thankful for each other.
 - Be thankful for God's promises.
 - Be thankful even when it's not easy.
- BENEATH THE SURFACE: a series on <u>Identity</u>, scripture focus = the Gospels
 - God helps us discover who we're becoming.
 - God's words help us discover who we are.
 - The right relationship helps us discover how to grow.
 - Jesus helps us discover purpose.
- JUSTIFIED: a series on <u>Anger</u>, scripture focus = New Testament
 - When you're angry, pause to ask God why.
 - When we're angry, Jesus shows us how to respond.
 - When you're angry, you can still show grace by not getting hurtful.
- **GLOW:** a series on <u>Easter</u>, *scripture focus* = *the Gospels*
 - Jesus is with us in the darkness
 - Jesus is THE light in the darkness
- IAM: a series on Jesus, scripture focus = the Gospels
 - Jesus is love.
 - Jesus is truth.
 - Jesus is always with us.
 - Jesus is our Savior.

Here are my hopes with this year:

- Our students follow Jesus because they're captured by his heart.
- Our students are comfortable sharing doubts & questions that ultimately strengthen their faith.
- Our students see Jesus as a friend, not a distant authority to obey.
- Our students get to know each other and practice discipling together.
- We want to get them talking, asking questions, and discovering answers!

EXPECTATIONS.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT ATTENDANCE

We HIGHLY encourage students to be here every week we meet. Missing a night means missing out on some awesome stuff! Of course life happens and we understand there are times when students are under the weather, etc.

We ask for 75% attendance because the material that we cover is critical to a young person's spiritual growth and the development in preparation for students' ongoing faith life! We want them to be as equipped with the armor of God as they can.

BEHAVIOR

We will honor the community values of **kindness**, **honesty**, **respect**, and **responsibility** in St. Mark's Middle School Ministry. Students are expected to treat each other, their leaders, and church property well. This is a space to extend love to everyone, no matter who they are – <u>all are welcome</u>. And no student has the right to take away another student's time with God. Students will get 2 or 3 warnings before bringing parents in for more severe action moves, *depending on the behavior*.

CELL PHONE POLICY

Cell phones aren't bad - we thank God for the technology He has given us!

We ask that students not be on their phones unless they are asked by the person leading from the stage. We may even incorporate them into what we do on Wednesday evenings! If student cell phones become an issue, they will be asked to either keep them at home or ask them to be put into a bucket until they go home.

*Parents will be brought in if it is a continued problem with a student.

WORSHIP ATTENDANCE

We love when students come on Sunday mornings! Our students being able to learn and worship alongside of their parents is something they'll never forget! We ask that, as a family, you make it a priority to come together. With you being the #1 discipler in your child's life – come, enjoy, and talk as a family together about what you've learned!

PARENTS. what you can do to support your student

- **Encouragement:** We thank you for the important role in encouraging your young person to be involved in middle school ministry! It's always awesome to see parents excited about their student coming on Wednesday nights.
- Involvement: You are the key in making this program work! Please know that we need you! If you are
 interested in helping with small groups, activity nights, meal prep & service, set up or anything else, WE
 WILL TAKE YOU! The Family Ministry team can't do it all on our own and we would love to have you be

- **Worship:** You are an advocate for your student making it a priority for your family to attend worship together is crucial for students to see the importance of a relationship with God.
- **Family Discussion:** Each Wednesday night, we want to challenge you to ask your student what he/she learned! It shows students that you, as a parent, are invested in their spiritual growth. How cool is it to talk about faith & life together?!
- **Family Night:** Generally one Wednesday of each month is a "Family Night" see the calendar of the year. It's a night reserved for you and your family to spend time together. YAY!

FOOD.

MMM, GOOD

Each week, we have awesome volunteers that get meals ready for us to fuel us for the evening. If you have selected the "add-on" of food for the year, your student will have one week that is dinner, and two weeks of the month that are a hefty snack.

WEATHER.

THERE'S A LOT OF UNPREDICTABILITY

St. Mark's will make the determination on whether Wednesday evening classes will be held based on the weather and road conditions at the church. Families will be notified no later than 2:00 pm on Wednesdays with an email and/or text message. Additionally, a cancellation notice will be shared with KCRG.

If Wednesday night programs are not cancelled but you are concerned about the weather, we ask that you use your best judgment regarding safe travel as to whether or not your child will attend that night.

CONFIRMATION

The next step for our 8th graders!

Confirmation has been a long-standing tradition where students go through a program learning about Martin Luther and what it means to be Lutheran. From there, students are expected to write a statement of faith.

This will now be a one-year intensive discipleship program. What will this time look like? Acts 2:42 says, "The devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread, and to prayer." We will be doing just that! We're going to learn from teaching (e.g. Teen Alpha, Lutheran theology) together, eat a meal together, discuss together, and pray together.

FIRST COMMUNION

Calling all 5th Graders! (and those who haven't had it yet!)

Communion is something we get to celebrate together as a church! We have the opportunity to remember Christ's sacrifice for us through the body and blood (bread & wine).
